GET TO KNOW OUR NEIGHBORHOODS

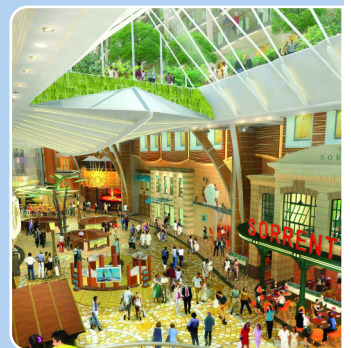

BOARDWALKSM - A slice of old-world charm with a modern twist. Introducing the one-of-a-kind AquaTheater and the first ever Carousel at sea. BoardwalkSM offers enough games, amusement and attractions to keep everyone entertained! Surrounded by casual restaurants, including Johnny Rockets® and the Seafood Shack, a coffee and donut shop, bars, candy shop and more, BoardwalkSM is the place to be for the entire family!

ROYAL PROMENADE - It will be the most expansive promenade at sea and will continue to be the heart of the ship. Except now, it's better than ever. For the first time, the Royal Promenade will have a mezzanine level that overlooks the space below and adds to the excitement of the Promenade. It features Rising Tide; a levitating bar that ascends and descends over three decks, and enough shops and restaurants to entertain even the most traveled of travelers. By morning, enjoy a relaxed atmosphere over coffee, and people watch. The ambiance becomes more energetic and vibrant in the afternoon with shopping, lunch, or drinks in the pub. In the evening, the energy rises with parades, nightlife, and entertainment for everyone. It's a destination unto itself!



CENTRAL PARKSM - Central ParkSM is a revolutionary public space combining nature with nautical. Elegant and lively, Central Park'sSM piazza is the ship's town square, which evolves from a tranquil and peaceful atmosphere during the day to a gathering space for dining, entertainment, and street performances in the evening. Central ParkSM features several alfresco dining options and more than 300 staterooms, which rise six decks to overlook the Park. GET READY TO EXPLORE THE CARIBBEAN

Oasis of the SeasSM will be sailing 7-Night Eastern and Western Caribbean itineraries for her inaugural year.

Her inaugural voyage is planned for December 12, 2009 out of her homeport of Port Everglades in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

The Eastern Caribbean itinerary will include ports of call at Charlotte Amalie, St. Thomas; Philipsburg, St. Maarten; and Nassau, Bahamas.

Starting May 1, 2010, Oasis of the SeasSM will alternate its Eastern Caribbean itinerary with the Western Caribbean itinerary, which will call at Labadee[®], Royal Caribbean's private beach destination in Haiti; the new port of Falmouth, Jamaica; and Cozumel, Mexico.

EXPLORE THE NEW ROYAL PROMENADE LOCATED ON DECK 5

The Royal Promenade will serve as the entry point for all guests embarking on Oasis of the SeasSM, rather than the traditional lower decks! A vast tree sculpture by international artist Larry Kirkland will serve as an impressive welcoming spot.

Additions to Royal Promenade, the heart of the ship, will include a mezzanine level that overlooks the main promenade below.

The Royal Promenade will be home to a vast array of shopping, dining and entertainment options including, the Rising Tide bar, the first moving bar at sea, which will traverse three decks and allow cruisers to enjoy a cocktail as they slowly ascend into Central ParkSM.

A focal point of the Royal Promenade will be a giant copper globe sculpture built into the facade above the Globe and Atlas Pub, which will "crack open" to create a spectacular, surprise element for guests, as it unfurls on hinged hydraulics and becomes a bridge platform for performances.

TAKE TIME TO RELAX IN ONE OF OUR NEW STATEROOMS

The glass partition between balconies can be opened! Guests may contact the Stateroom Attendant who can unlock it for them. (Exception: Loft balcony staterooms)
