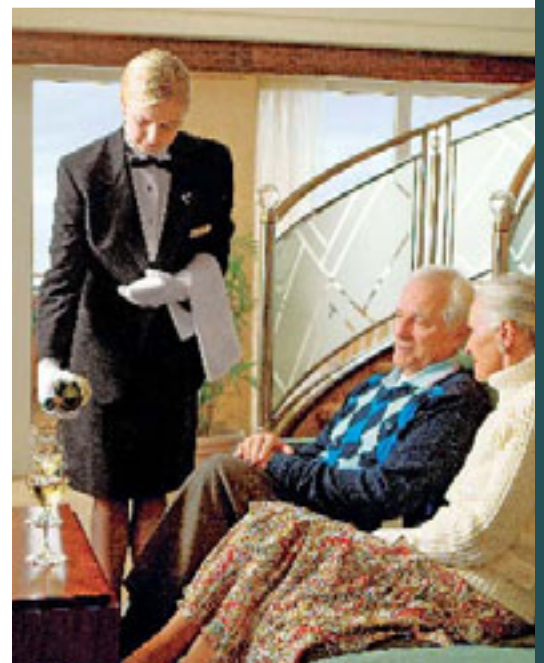

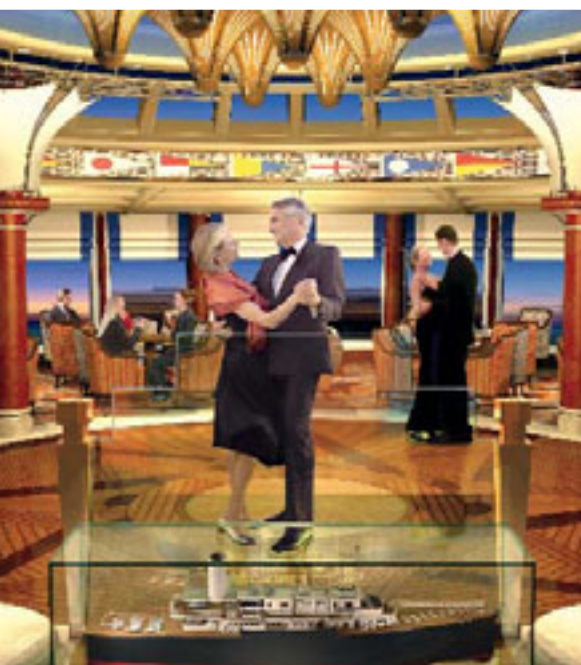


### TODD ENGLISH RESTAURANT<sup>†</sup>

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

A voyage on **QUEEN MARY 2**, **QUEEN VICTORIA** or **QUEEN ELIZABETH** promises wonderful times and a lifetime of memories. To ensure the most superb vacation possible, you'll want to be sure you're well prepared before you depart. Here are answers to some of the questions you may have about a Cunard voyage.

### What's included in my fare?

All fares include accommodations as booked, on-board meals\* and entertainment. Fares are per person based on double occupancy, cruise only, excluding air and transfers. Fares do not include government fees and taxes, fuel supplement, optional travel protection, and incidental charges such as laundry, bar expenses, spa and salon treatments, shore excursions, etc. Full details of fares are available through your Travel Agent, 1-800-7-CUNARD (728-6273) or [cunard.com](http://cunard.com).

### Is there an advantage to reserving early?

Yes. When you reserve early, you have access to a greater selection of accommodations, ensuring you get just the stateroom or suite you prefer on your voyage.

### How does tipping work?

During your voyage, you will meet staff throughout the ship who provide you with excellent service. Many more crew support those who serve you directly. A discretionary Hotel and Dining charge will be added to your shipboard account on a daily basis (including children). This charge will be shared amongst all those who help provide and support your experience, including the waitstaff, stateroom stewards, buffet stewards and others. Please note, this is a discretionary charge and should you wish to remove it or make any adjustments, contact the Purser's Desk before the end of the voyage.

GRILL ACCOMMODATIONS: \$13 USD per person per day†  
ALL OTHER ACCOMMODATIONS: \$11 USD per person per day†

Note: Casino dealers and Spa personnel do not share in the Hotel and Dining charge as not all guests utilise these services.

### What about gratuities in the bars?

A 15% gratuity is added to your bar charges and dining room wine account. This is shared amongst the beverage staff and their support staff.

### What if I'm travelling by myself?

Cunard welcomes single travellers on every voyage. There are countless ways to meet interesting people on board your voyage — by attending the "Welcome Cocktail Party," by choosing to sit at a larger table for dinner, and through activities like lectures and Bridge class. For ladies travelling alone, Gentleman Dance Hosts make great dance partners.

For those who wish to travel as the sole occupant of a double occupancy stateroom, the following single supplements typically apply:

For Grill categories (Q1-Q7 and P1-P4), singles pay 200% of double-occupancy fares. For all other categories (AA/A1-D8), singles pay 175% of double-occupancy fares.†

Please be aware that supplements may vary and are subject to change without prior notification. Contact your Travel Agent or call 1-800-7-CUNARD (728-6273) for details.

### What about third or fourth guests?

Fares for third/fourth guests in a stateroom vary by ship, sailing and stateroom category. All third and fourth guests pay the same fare, including children except children under 2 years of age travelling as a 3rd or 4th guest who are not required to pay cruise fare. Not all staterooms and suites are equipped for additional guests; please consult the deck plans for more information, or contact your Travel Agent or Cunard for details.

### Are children welcome on Cunard?

Children at least six months of age are welcome on most Cunard voyages; on Transatlantic Crossings, Transpacific voyages (including voyages to Hawaii) and World Voyages (including Segment Voyages), the minimum age is one year. We offer a full children's programme, from nursery to teens, so families can share this special journey together.

We provide supervised activities for children aged two to 17 years throughout the day, and also offer free group supervision in the evening.

A child travelling as the second guest in a stateroom requires payment of the published per-person fare. In order to provide adequate activities and facilities for our younger guests, the number of children on a specific voyage may be limited; please contact Cunard for details. Guests under the age of 18 are not permitted to gamble or enter the casino. Guests who are under 18 years of age are not permitted to purchase or consume alcohol on board. However, whilst in U.S. waters, Cunard Line enforces and abides by the U.S. legal drinking age of 21 years.

### Are dogs welcome?

**QUEEN MARY 2**'s kennel programme is available on all Transatlantic Crossings between New York and Southampton in either direction, and is managed by a full-time Kennel Master who takes care of responsibilities such as feeding, walking and cleaning the ship's 12 spacious kennels. Travelling dogs and cats also receive a complimentary gift pack and other animal amenities. The kennels and adjacent indoor and outdoor walking areas are open throughout the day, enabling guests to spend significant time with their pets. Reservations for the kennels may be made at time of booking, and are based on availability. Contact Cunard for fees, details and additional requirements. All animals must be in compliance with the Pets Travel Scheme and in possession of a pet passport.

### Are service animals/guide dogs welcome?

Cunard is pleased to permit individuals to bring service animals on board. You must provide notice of this at time of booking. Local laws or customs may prevent animals from disembarking at particular ports or countries. It is the guest's responsibility to consult local customs authorities for requirements and to obtain all applicable documents and health certificates. Service animals are kept in staterooms with their owners. Non-service animals are only carried on **QUEEN MARY 2** Transatlantic Crossings, in kennels, and are not allowed to visit any guest area of the ship.

## BEFORE YOU SAIL

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### How can my loved ones reach me on board?

Friends and family can reach you by email, which you will be able to check in the ship's computer centre or via your laptop with wi-fi access in the staterooms and public areas (service charge applies). In addition, mobile phones may be used on board — check with your service provider before you leave to confirm you have international roaming service enabled.

### What sort of attire should I bring?

During the day, casual attire is always appropriate throughout the ship. Evenings on all voyages are designated either Formal, Semi-Formal or Elegant Casual with dress suggestions listed in the ship's Daily Programme. Formal nights are among the most unique and exciting moments of many voyages — an all-too-rare opportunity to dress to the nines as you celebrate a Royal Nights grand ball. However, even on Formal evenings, more Elegant Casual attire is perfectly acceptable at certain alternative dining venues.

**FORMAL:** Black tie or formal dark suit for gentlemen. Evening dress or other formal attire for ladies. Military or Award decorations may be worn on formal nights. A range of gentlemen's formal wear is available to hire or purchase on board the ship.

**SEMI-FORMAL:** Jacket and tie for gentlemen. Cocktail dress or trouser suit for ladies. No jeans.

**ELEGANT CASUAL:** Jacket, no tie required for gentlemen. Dress, skirt or trousers for ladies. No jeans.

On shore, you'll want comfortable clothes for sightseeing. The type of clothes you bring depends on the itinerary. Even in warmer climates, it can get cold on deck, so some warmer clothes are always advised. It is advisable to bring a lightweight raincoat and umbrella, and you'll want to make sure you have proper attire for visiting shrines, churches, mosques and temples (i.e. leg and shoulder coverings for both men and women).

### Can I arrange to have someone handle my luggage to and from the ship?

We offer White Star Luggage Service, which is provided by a reputable carrier and is available exclusively to our guests. Continental U.S. reservations must be secured at least 35 days prior to sailing date. Service can be requested within 35 days of sailing at an additional cost and is based on destination and availability. Please note you can purchase service home whilst on the ship. Additional terms and conditions apply. Call 1-888-491-0774 for more information.

## WHILST ON BOARD

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### How many formal nights are there?

Formal nights are one of the most distinctive parts of the Cunard experience, and a great opportunity to socialise with like-minded travellers. The number of formal nights varies by voyage and will be detailed in your pre-voyage documents. Transatlantic Crossings typically have three formal nights, other voyages two to five depending on length and numbers of sea days. Of course, single travellers are welcome at all events, and Gentlemen Dance Hosts are on board to waltz and salsa with single ladies.

### Who else will sail with us?

The range of sophisticated travellers on board Cunard runs wider than you may expect — from honeymooners to golden anniversaries, from celebrities and tycoons to friends and neighbours. The shared interest in the rich cultural experience on board brings together guests of all ages and a variety of backgrounds. Plus, one of the unique advantages of a Cunard voyage is the international clientele. Their fame and style make our liners magnets for interesting people from all over the world — a wonderful opportunity for travellers who like to explore different cultures.

### Is there internet connection on board?

Each ship's computer centre offers internet access via PC. Guests with laptops may access the web via our wireless network, available in every stateroom as well as many public rooms. Charges apply for these services.

### Will I need money on board?

The Purser's Desk is the financial centre on board the ship. The official currency aboard all ships is the U.S. dollar. For your convenience, we ask that you pre-register your credit card at embarkation. Most on-board expenses are automatically added to this account. At the voyage end, your account may be left on this credit card for the easiest possible settling, or may be transferred to another card or paid by cash or travellers' cheques.

### Will I be able to clean my clothes on board?

Yes. Full laundry and dry cleaning services are available on board, and will be billed to your stateroom. Complimentary self-service washers, dryers and ironing facilities are also available.

### Are there medical facilities on board?

Yes, although these basic medical facilities are equipped primarily to deal with illness and accidents, and are not intended to provide ongoing treatment of pre-existing conditions. If you anticipate a need for medical services aboard the ship, your special requirement must be cleared in writing with Cunard before your booking can be finalised. Because medical facilities are limited and shoreside medical care is not always readily available, we will not be able to carry guests who will be 24 weeks or more pregnant by the end of the intended voyage.

### Is smoking permitted in the ships' public areas?

Smoking is no longer permitted in any of the public rooms with the exception of Churchill's Cigar Lounge and designated areas on the open deck. Smoking will still, however, be allowed in all staterooms and all stateroom balconies. These regulations may be subject to further change in the future.

## GOING ONSHORE

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### How long will we be ashore in each port?

Port visits range from a morning ashore to two full days. Morning calls typically arrive between 7 and 9 a.m., and depart between noon and 2 p.m. Afternoon calls arrive between noon and 2 p.m., and depart between 5 and 7 p.m. Full day calls arrive between 7 and 10 a.m., and depart between 4 to 8 p.m. Afternoon & Evening or Full Day & Evening calls depart between 9 and 11:59 p.m. Full Day, Overnight & Morning calls arrive between 7 and 10 a.m. and depart between noon and 2 p.m. the next day. Afternoon, Overnight & Full Day calls arrive between noon and 2 p.m. and depart between 4 and 8 p.m. the next day. Two Full Days calls arrive between 7 and 10 a.m. and depart between 4 and 11:59 p.m. the next evening. Afternoon & Overnight calls arrive between noon and 2 p.m. and depart early the next morning, whilst Afternoon, Overnight & Morning calls arrive between noon and 2 p.m. and depart between noon and 2 p.m. the following day.

### How do I plan my shore excursions?

A brochure explaining all the shore excursions that will be offered on your voyage will be included with your preliminary voyage documents. Many shore excursions have limited space available, so reservation requests will be processed in the order received. Therefore, we encourage you to reserve tours as early as possible by returning the tour request form included with your preliminary documents or online at [cunard.com](http://cunard.com). When excursions are fully booked, additional requests will be placed on the waiting list in the order received. Your tickets will be delivered to your stateroom on embarkation day and will be charged to your stateroom account. Throughout your voyage, there will be informative briefings announced in the ship's Daily Programme that will include tour information, shopping advice and other practical suggestions for the ports you will visit. You will also have the ability to view the port briefings and reserve shore excursions from the comfort of your stateroom. Our on-board tour staff can assist you in creating private tours for your party, using our Quality Guides. Shore excursions are operated by local, independent companies, not by Cunard.

## CUNARDCARE®

A Cunard voyage is a time to relax and forget your cares — all of them. This is made easier when you include Cunard's Guest Protection Programme in your plans. With CunardCare, you need not worry about the unexpected, even if you have to cancel due to illness. With CunardCare, you have the peace of mind that comes with a protection programme designed specifically for voyage guests. CunardCare protects your voyage payment — up to \$50,000 per guest — if your trip is cancelled or interrupted due to unforeseen eligible medical conditions affecting you, your immediate family or travelling companion sharing your stateroom. This amount is higher than some of the other plans that are not specifically designed for voyage guests. In addition, if you have an eligible trip cancellation claim which exceeds the \$50,000 cash reimbursement, Cunard will supplement this with a future travel credit to make up the difference.

### FUTURE TRAVEL CREDIT FEATURE

If you must cancel your voyage because of a pre-existing condition, and your refund request is denied on the basis of this exclusion, Cunard will issue a future travel credit equal to the non-refundable cancellation fees imposed less the programme plan cost.

In New York and Southampton, we also arrange service to key regional train and bus terminals. Options available for your voyage will be detailed in your preliminary travel documents — contact your Travel Agent or Cunard to pre-arrange these on your behalf.

Transfer options may vary by port and sailing date; please refer to preliminary documents for specific offerings on your voyage.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

Cunard Line is a brand of Carnival plc.

### RESPONSIBILITY

Transportation of guests and baggage on Cunard is governed by the Cunard Passage Contract, a copy of which will be included with your preliminary documents and is also available upon request. The Passage Contract represents the entire agreement between Cunard and the guest. It is important that you carefully read the entire Passage Contract, as it sets out the rights and responsibilities of Cunard and the guest.

Cunard shall have the right to cancel or alter in any way any scheduled sailing or itinerary which, in its sole judgment and discretion, is justified for any reason and to do so without liability for damage or for any loss to guests. Cunard also reserves the right, in the event of a full-ship charter or for any other reason, to cancel reservations and bookings whether or not a deposit or full payment has been received. In such an event, Cunard's only liability will be to refund to guests the amount it has received.

The guest is responsible for arriving at the respective ports on time for embarkation and for joining the vessel at its next port of call, if for any reason, a scheduled sailing is missed. Cunard reserves the right to refuse or discontinue passage to anyone when in Cunard's sole judgment, it would be considered a risk to the guest's own safety, well-being and health or a risk to the safety, well-being, comfort and enjoyment of any other guest or crewmember.

### DEPOSITS

A 25% deposit (30% for World Voyages) is required within three days of reservation or sooner, as specified by Cunard. Staterooms are subject to cancellation if required deposit amount is not received within the specified option period.

### BALANCE OF PAYMENT

Full payment for all voyages less than 30 days must be received by Cunard no later than 90 days prior to sailing. All reservations are subject to cancellation if payments are not received by the due date, and are guaranteed only when paid in full at 90 days prior to sailing. Final payment is due at 120 days prior to all voyages 30 days or longer. Reservations made between 90 and 31 days of sailing require full payment within 24 hours of booking. Reservations made within 30 days of sailing require full payment at time of booking.

### METHODS OF PAYMENT

Only U.S. dollar payments are accepted via agency check, personal check, American Express, MasterCard, Visa, Diner's Club or Discover Card. Expenses incurred for on-board services/products by the guest or by Cunard on behalf of guests, shall be paid by guest prior to embarkation.

The above cancellation charges apply to all travel including cruise, airfare, land arrangements and optional hotel/land extensions. If non-cruise components only are cancelled, the guest will be responsible for any cancellation charges imposed by the airlines, other transportation carriers, tour and ground operators or hotel properties.

### REFUNDS

Before a determination regarding a refund can be made, all cruise and air documents must first be returned to: Cunard Line, 24303 Town Center Drive, Valencia, California 91355. Partial use of cruise, airfare, hotel and land extension does not qualify a guest for a refund. All refund requests pertaining to cruise, land and air are subject to final review by Cunard.

### CUNARDCARE®

We strongly recommend that all guests purchase some form of travel insurance that includes Trip Cancellation/Interruption as well as medical expenses and emergency evacuation benefits. For your convenience, we offer CunardCare which includes these valuable benefits and more. Your Travel Agent can provide additional information about the CunardCare Travel Protection Programme which has been specially designed and economically priced exclusively for Cunard guests.

### BAGGAGE AND VALUABLES

Though we take reasonable care in the handling of baggage, Cunard's responsibility for lost, damaged or misplaced baggage

and other personal property is limited by the Passage Contract. Cunard Line is not responsible for camera equipment, laptops, cash or other similarly fragile and valuable items contained in checked or unchecked baggage. These items, as well as medications and prescriptions in their original packaging, should be carried on and off the ships by the guests themselves. Safe-deposit boxes or in-room safes are available free of charge on board. For your safety, all guests and all baggage must pass a security checkpoint.

### CHILDREN TRAVELLING WITH AN ADULT

Children under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult and must be at least six months of age to sail. See page 88 for restrictions.

### EMBARKATION/DISEMBARKATION

The ship generally will be available for embarkation four hours before the scheduled sailing time. Due to limited facilities, guests should not arrive earlier than the embarkation time noted on final documents. On disembarkation day, staterooms must be vacated at the time advised by the Hotel Manager. Once customs and immigration clearance has been completed, guests making their own air arrangements should allow three to four hours for transfer time to the airport.

Cunard Line offers optional transfers and hospitality services to the port on embarkation day. Group transfers and services use motor-coaches or minibuses; private transfers use luxury sedans for two guests or luxury club vans for four to eight guests.

Where available, hospitality services provide you with transfers from your incoming flight to a deluxe hotel at which point your luggage is transported from the hotel directly to the ship. You are free to relax and enjoy the comforts of a Cunard hospitality room and use the hotel as a base from which to explore. Call your travel agent or 1-800-7-CUNARD for more information.

### GUESTS WITH DISABILITIES/SPECIAL DIETS

Guests with disabilities are welcome aboard Cunard vessels. Due to the configuration of our ships, however, wheelchair users and individuals with sight impairments may experience some difficulties in accessing certain areas. Where any individual would be unable to be safely and comfortably accommodated, we suggest that the guest be accompanied by a companion. Some ports of call require tenders to go ashore and may preclude passengers using a wheelchair from leaving the vessel; this decision must be made by the ship's Captain and is binding. Upon notification by a guest with a disability, Cunard Reservations will provide stateroom and bathroom doorway widths and other pertinent access limitations on board the vessels. Cunard is pleased to permit individuals to bring service animals on board. In order to make appropriate arrangements, notice that a guest will be travelling with an animal must be provided at the time of booking. Local laws or customs may prevent animals from disembarking at particular ports and countries. It is the guest's obligation to obtain all documents/health certificates that may be required. Consult local customs authorities for information and requirements.

Guests with conditions requiring ongoing medical assistance may be asked to have their physician provide a confidential certification form to ensure that they may travel safely. If guests have special dietary needs, Cunard must be advised at time of booking or, at the latest, six weeks before sailing. Every effort will be made to comply with such requests.

### FUEL SUPPLEMENT

At time of publication, Cunard is imposing a fuel supplement of \$3.85 per day, per person (up to a maximum of \$154 per person) on all guests who have reserved on or after 10 May 2010 for sailings on or after 1 Nov 2010. This fuel supplement amount is subject to change even if the fare has already been paid in full.

### GOVERNMENT FEES AND TAXES

"Government Fees and Taxes" may include any and all fees, charges, tolls and taxes imposed by U.S. and/or foreign governmental or quasi-governmental authorities, including but not limited to U.S. customs fees, head taxes, Panama Canal tolls, dockage fees, wharfage fees, air taxes, hotel or VAT taxes incurred as part of a land tour, inspection fees, immigration and naturalisation fees, and Internal Revenue Service fees, whether assessed on a per guest, per berth, per ton or per vessel basis. In the case of per ton or per vessel assessments, those assessments will be spread over the guests on board. Government Fees and Taxes are subject to change and Cunard reserves the right to collect any increases in effect at the time of sailing, even if the fare has already been paid in full.

### OPTIONAL AIR PROGRAMME

The availability of the air travel programme may be limited from each gateway. Cunard reserves the right to withdraw any gateway city without prior notice.

Cunard reserves the right to choose the air carrier, service, routing and airport for each gateway city. Airline tickets issued by Cunard are highly restrictive and subject to cancellation and change fees. All airline tickets are the property of Cunard and must be returned to and are refundable only to Cunard. Flight schedules may require that you make connections or stops en route to your final destination or cruise departure. Charges may apply if you change or cancel your air arrangements prior to departure. An additional per-person fee of \$75 for Domestic flights and \$125 for International flights may be charged for air-related changes beginning 75 days prior to sailing.

Some countries require guests to pay an airport departure tax which is not included on the guest air ticket. In most cases, this tax is collected at the airport upon check-in and may have to be paid in local currency. We recommend your travel agent verify any applicable tax for which the guest is to be responsible.

Air fees, taxes and surcharges include all charges related to air transportation imposed by U.S. and/or foreign governmental or quasi-governmental authorities, including airport facility charges, departure taxes, security taxes and surcharges including the September 11 Security Fee, airport service charges and government inspection fees. Air fees, taxes and surcharges vary by gateway city, routing, destination and carrier. Air fees, taxes and surcharges are estimated for each gateway city and are subject to change before receipt of final payment. Before receipt of final payment, adjustments may be made if actual air fees, taxes and surcharges are higher or lower than originally estimated.

Airline seat assignments cannot be confirmed by Cunard. Please be advised that not all airlines provide pre-reserved seats. Requests for wheelchair assistance or other special needs, such as oxygen in-flight can only be made directly with the air carrier and are the responsibility of the traveller. Not all airlines allow the use of oxygen in-flight.

It is strongly recommended that you verify both flight departure times and flight numbers at least 72 hours prior to your departure from home. Cunard is not responsible for airline schedule changes after tickets have been issued.

### SERVICES PROVIDED BY INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS

All shoreside tours and services described in this brochure, including air, transfers and shore excursions are provided by independent contractors. Cunard acts solely as the ticketing agent for all shoreside activities. Cunard shall have no obligation or liability of any kind to guests for acts or omissions in connection with or arising out of arrangements with independent contractors, including but not limited to airline carriers, ground/tour operators, hotels and on-board physicians since they are neither agents for nor employees of Cunard.

### INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL DOCUMENTS & HEALTH INFORMATION

It is the guest's obligation to obtain and carry with him/her a valid passport, visas, parental authorisations if required, and public health documents for all applicable ports of call and overland tour destinations. Your passport must be valid for a minimum of six months past the last day of your trip. Consult your travel agent for advice on such requirements. For non-U.S. citizens or non-U.S. legal residents disembarking in a U.S. port, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security requires you to provide your address whilst in the United States after your voyage.

Approximately three months prior to departure, guests will be sent a visa application package and requirements for their specific itinerary from an independent visa service agency. We strongly recommend that all guests avail themselves of this service. Depending on the area of the world visited, vaccination/immunization requirements vary considerably, and are subject to change at any time. We suggest that guests travelling outside of their country of residence consider being immunized against Hepatitis A, Typhoid, Diphtheria, Polio and Tetanus. An international certificate, approved by the World Health Organization, is the best medium for verification that inoculations and vaccinations have been satisfactorily performed, and is accepted by health officials at all ports of call. We strongly recommend that all guests contact their personal physician, the Department of Public Health or the Centers for Disease Control to obtain expert medical immunization recommendations for their intended itinerary and travel plans and to specifically address Malaria and Yellow Fever requirements in time to receive any necessary vaccinations/immunisations. Any Malaria prophylaxis medication recommended must be obtained prior to joining the vessel.

Every effort has been made to ensure that the information presented is accurate at the time of printing. Ship details and other information presented are subject to change at any time, at the discretion of Cunard.

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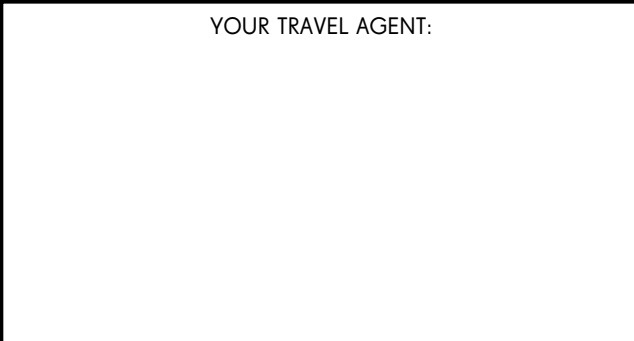
